### RECIPE: PONCHA

#### Ingredients:

- 3/4 cups of honey
- Juice of 6 lemons (about 1 1/2 cups)
- 3/4 cups of white brandy (aguardente) or rum

#### Directions:

Put honey and lemon juice into a jar. Stand a mechelote (traditional poncha stirring stick) in the jar, hold the handle of the mechelote between the palms of your hands and rub them back and forth agitating the liquid until the honey dissolves. Stir the white brandy and mix the liquid one more time. Serve the drink and enjoy it!

After the practicing session on Tuesday, yesterday the team competition matches took place at the Sports Hall. All teams seemed confident and excited with the matches' results during the morning. The most confident and feared teams were the eastern ones, namely the Russian and the Polish. Coaches and athletes alike were not giving up though; they were all making an effort to conquer a title. During the afternoon the women's and men's team competition continued with some good surprises. Regarding the Men's competition, in group A Kazan Federal University achieved the first place with 6 points, flawless throughout the day. Second place in the group went to

the University of Bordeaux, who won the change to compete today in the quarter finals. Group B saw the University of Rzeszow achieving first place, with 6 points, and the University of Geneva conquering the second place with 5 points. In group C, the Russian State University for the Humanities dominated and achieved first place, followed by the Józef Rusiecki Olsztyn University. Finally, in group D the University of Ljubljana, one of the surprises of the day, achieved first place while the University of Cambridge followed, with 5 points in total.

As for the Women's competition, in group A the University of Warsaw conquered first place, with 6 points, and the Moscow State University of Railway Engineering got second place with 5 points. In group B Kazan Federal University dominated and achieved first place, closely followed the University of Wroclaw. Today, they all have a chance to reach the anticipated finals at 6.30 pm. **IAKOVOS IAKOVOU**, University of Cyprus. Stated that he did not know what to wait of the championship, however, he said that the competition was better than what he expected.
